Hot Tip

Dried Fruit Preservative

"I dry a lot of fresh fruit during the summer so I mix 1/2 teaspoon potassium metabisulfite with 2 quarts water and dip fresh fruit in this mixture. It will keep fruit from turning brown when being dried. I find that it works much better than lemon juice."

Cellar Craft Limited Releases for 2012 Announced

Lots of you have been asking about the 2012 Limited Release lineup from Cellar Craft. It has now been confirmed. Here's a quick rundown with pricing:

January release: [#CFLR112—Pinot Noir](#) – from Sonoma Coast, California, \$139.00

February release: [#CFLR212—Nebbiolo](#) – from Madera, California \$139.00

March release: [#CFLR312—Sauvignon Blanc/Semillon/Chardonnay](#) (37%, 35%, & 28% respectively) from California and Yakima Valley, \$139.00

April release: [#CFLR412—Red Mountain Trio](#) – 50% Cab, 35% Syrah, and 15% Merlot – from Red Mountain, Washington, \$139.00

Pre-order deadlines are the 15th of the month prior to the release month of each kit. For instance, if you wish to order the Pinot Noir, you should place your order by December 15, 2011. Red wine kits shown above ship with crushed grape packs.

[#RQ512—Down Under Syrah](#) (Syrah, Merlot, Rosé) only \$108.95. **Orders must be received by Dec. 5.**

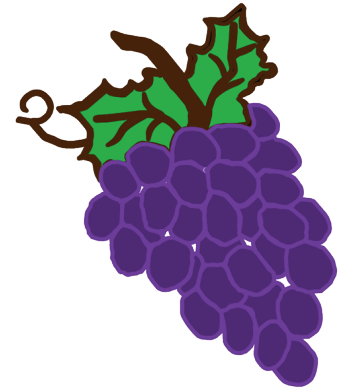

A component of wine that is formed during the oxidation of alcohol. It is midway between an acid and an alcohol.



Don't Preserve It

If you purchase juice at your local market to make wine, be sure to check the label and get juice labeled with NO PRESERVATIVES.

The preservatives in the juice will not allow the yeast to work.

Diabetes is a rapidly growing health concern in the United States. Cases of Type 2 diabetes have increased by more than 60 percent since 1991, and health experts estimate it will affect 40 million Americans by 2050. But a new study suggests that moderate alcohol consumption, including wine, can reduce the odds of developing diabetes, particularly in women. Scientists found that moderate drinking lowered the risk by 19 percent among men and 37 percent among women aged 50 to 71. [Get more info.](#)
